Project Management Programs Most Frequently Asked Questions

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

STONY BROOK UNIVERSITY with the Long Island Chapter of the Project Management Institute (PMI®) and TOTAL SYSTEMS EDUCATION, LTD. is proud to bring professional Project Management and Business Analysis training to Long Island! Courses are hosted by Stony Brook's Corporate Education and Training and are taught by Total Systems Education's professional PMP staff. Workshops are scheduled on a regular basis (see www.licet.org) at Stony Brook University and are also available for in-house delivery. Total Systems Education, Ltd. is a PMI Global Registered Education provider (R.E.P.) and all training is accepted as "Contact Hours" for those preparing for their Project Management Professional Certification, PMP®, and as Professional Development Units (PDU®) for those working to maintain their PMP credential.



1) What are the requirements to earn a PMP Certification?

PRIOR to taking the PMP Examination, PMI requires that those with a baccalaureate degree have 4,500 hours leading and directing specific project tasks, 36 months of project management experience and 35 "Contact Hours" of Project Management training. No specific courses are mandated, but the Stony Brook courses make the most sense.

PP&C provides concept foundation, tools and techniques for anyone involved in projects. If you have a specific need, such as leadership, take our PROJECT LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP. If you need help making presentations, try MAKING PRESENTATIONS IN THE PROJECT WORLD. Our program offers the flexibility to simply enroll in the classes you want. If at some point you decide that you would like to earn one of our certificates or your PMP, all courses you've attended would be applied.

2) Is the Professional Engineers Project Management program similar to the Stony Brook Professional Project Management Certificate Program?

Both programs require Project Planning and Control. In fact, PP&C is the "Foundations" workshop for all programs, including the STONY BROOK PROFESSIONAL BUSINESS ANALYSIS CERTIFICATE PROGRAM. PP&C has been certified by both PMI (for 24 PDUs/Contact Hours) and NYSSPE for 24 PDHs.

5) Why is *Determining Business Requirements* required in both the Professional Project Management and Business Analysis Certificate Programs?

It's all connected! Would you ever build a house without deciding how many rooms you need or how much money it will cost? Projects are the same. Requirements are the foundation of good Business Analysis. First we develop non-technical requirements, then we build more detailed specifications, and then move on to a technical design. Once the project is finished, testing is completed to make sure we built what our clients need.

3) Does Stony Brook offer any such courses in Project Management with an introduction to ISO and Six Sigma?

PP&C does touch on ISO and Six Sigma, but does not specifically teach them (*Determining Business Requirements* also addresses Scope and Quality issues in great detail.) There are other Stony Brook programs outside of the PM curriculum which directly address ISO and Six Sigma.

6) If I attend these classes in-house, can they be used towards a Stony Brook University Certificate Program in Project Management or Business Analysis?

Yes! If your company chooses to run our courses at your site, the same Stony Brook certifications are available for all attendees. You should also know that on request, in-house workshop delivery will be customized to include specifics of your organization's processes and guidelines.
